"Women Lead": Women farmers' Leadership Program "Enhancing women farmer's participation in decision—making



Although women make up well over half of the labor force in African agriculture, there is a lack of adequate representation for women and recognition of their voices and rights, in their Farmers Organizations. The Pan-African Farmers' Federation (PAFO) had identified this problem and wants to contribute to strengthening the role of women in leadership positions and their networking in the long term. Thus, PAFO recently signed an MoU with the Andreas Hermes Academy (AHA) to build the capacity of women in leadership and decision-making. The objectives of this programme is to build the capacity in order to have more capable women in leadership positions in regional and national farmers' associations; Networking and relationship building among women at the international level (Germany - African partner country), regional and national levels.

"Women Lead" is a project is implemented by PAFO-AHA in cooperation with the German Rural Women Association (<u>Deutscher LandFrauenverband e.V. - dlv</u>) to create pan-African role models for the empowerment of women in

agricultural associations and Farmers Organisations and to put them on the continental agenda.

The first leg of the program brings together 20 rural women, 15 from African farmers Organization and 5 members from dlv) for an intensive training, peer learning and study tour. This is followed by a tandem coaching phase lasting several months and a second leg of live program and a completion event that will highlight the achievements of the program and ensure that the women gain visibility as role models. The second phase of the live program will be held in Berlin, Germany.

PAFO and AHA are collaborating together to strengthen the system of farmer organizations in Africa, professionalize and capacitate regional and national farmer organizations, men, women, and youth, including organizational and individual capacity building. Through a continental approach, regional (RFO) and national FOs (NFO – approached through the RFO) shall be better equipped to live up to their mandate, address today's challenges, raise the farmer's voice, and serve their members.

The project "Women Lead" is implemented with the financial support of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).
