## "Women Lead": Leadership program for rural women "Strengthening women's participation in decision-making".



Although women account for more than half of the workforce in African agriculture, they are under-represented and their voices and rights are not recognized within their farmers' organizations. The Pan-African Farmers' Organization (PAFO) has identified this problem and is keen to help strengthen the role of women in decision-making positions, as well as their long-term networking. To this end, PAFO recently signed a memorandum of understanding with Andreas Hermes Academy (AHA) to strengthen women's leadership and decision-making skills. The objectives of this program are to build capacity so that more competent women take up leadership positions in regional and national farmers' organizations; To create networks and relationships between women at international (Germany - African partner countries), regional and national levels.

"Les Femmes Dirigent" (Women Lead) is a project implemented by PAFO- AHA, in cooperation with the German Rural Women's Association (Deutscher LandFrauenverband e.V. - dlv), to create pan-African models of women's empowerment in farmers' associations and organizations and put them on the continent's agenda.

The first phase of the program brings together 20 rural women (15 members of the African Farmers' Organization and 5 members of dlv), for intensive training, peer learning and a study tour. This is followed by a tandem coaching phase lasting several months, a second face-to-face phase of the program and a closing event that will highlight the program's achievements and ensure that rural women gain visibility as role models. The second phase of the face-to-face program will take place in Berlin, Germany.

PAFO and AHA are working together to strengthen the system of farmers' organizations in Africa, professionalizing and building the capacities of RFOs and NPOs, men, women and youth, including organizational and individual capacity building. Thanks to a continental approach, regional farmers' organizations (RFOs) and national farmers' organizations (NPOs) - approached through RFOs - will be better equipped to fulfill their mandates, meet today's challenges, make rural women's voices heard and better serve their members.

The "Women Lead" project is implemented with financial support from the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).
