

As the FO4ACP program draws to a close, it is important to underline the vital importance of the international partnership for the development of farmers' organizations (FOs). Since 2019, this program - made possible thanks to the commitment of key partners such as OACPS, the EU and IFAD - has significantly strengthened the technical, organizational and business capacities of African FOs.

FO4ACP has helped to improve the livelihoods of millions of smallholder farmers across the continent through better practices and access to markets, as well as creating off-farm jobs and income, especially for young people and women. Not to mention greater resilience to climatic and economic shocks.



But despite these remarkable results, the work is not over. The challenges for our organizations and members remain immense in the face of the climate emergency, soaring input prices and the economic crisis.

and the global economic crisis. That is why it is vital to continue and strengthen this international partnership, which has proved its worth and is more necessary than ever. A stronger international partnership would make it possible to consolidate the achievements and positive impacts of the FO4ACP program, build on the progress made to go even further, extend the benefits to a larger number of producers and help producer organizations adapt to the new challenges.

The current crises (climate, health, economic) are disrupting the production and livelihoods of our producers. Our organizations need support to adapt to these new challenges and to continue to serve their members effectively. PAFO and its member farmers' organizations are key players in agricultural and rural development in Africa. With the support of partners such as the European Union and the IDF, a continuation of the FO4ACP program would help improve the livelihoods of millions of smallholder family farmers. African farmers are ready to meet the challenge of sustainable, high-performing agriculture. But they need the support of partners like the European Union to get there.

We are pleased to present, to our members, partners and stakeholders, the July 2024 edition of our newsletter which provides an overview of the various programs of activities we carried out during the last quarter. With the support of our partners continue to implement the various pillars of our current **Strategic Plan** to deliver the activities developed in the plan.

The key activities during the reviewed period include the first Board meeting of the year held virtually in May, a workshop on the evaluation of the FO4ACP program which also took place in the same month in Kigali where our members and the program partners gathered together, for three days, to evaluate the program implementation. Also, we held a virtual workshop to discuss our organizational development process and considered the reports of the two working groups, on vision and governance, that were earlier set up in March.



The African Development Bank (AfDB) renewed the membership of PAFO to represent the agriculture sector in its civil society committee. PAFO chaired the meeting of the steering committee meeting of the Farmers' Organizations at the Forefront of Research and Innovation in Agroecology for Sustainable Food Systems (FORI) program to review the execution of the program. During the meeting, the partners expressed satisfaction with the progress made in the implementation.

A virtual meeting was held to evaluate the implementation of the Digital Resilience and Nutrition Policy Innovations (DERPIn) project. The meeting provided an avenue for the implementing NFOs and partners to discuss the project's progress to ensure that it is on track in the implementation of the planned activities.

The Pan-African FO Exchange Platform continues its capacity building activities that focuses on such issues as strategic planning, governance, communication and commercialization. Moreover, we published a book on "Managing farmers' knowledge: Good experiences and promising practices from the FO4ACP KM event" to document the success stories of our members in the implementation of the FO4ACP program. We continue to strengthen existing partnerships while reaching out to new partners.

The women leadership development program was held in Munich, Germany during the period. The PAFO Secretariat's staff strength was reinforced with the resumption of Mr. Aimable Twagirayezu as the Programme Officer.

Finally, we look forward to your continued support as we build the capacity of our members and advocate for a favourable enabling environment that will improve their income and welfare.



### **PAFO EVENTS IN TANZANIA**











PAFO and its member networks will gather in Dar Es Salam, Tanzania, from 15 to 19 July for a series of events. These activities include an organizational development (OD) workshop in partnership with AHA; the Supporting the sustainability of the Panafrican FO exchange platform workshop, with the support of FO4ACP; and PAFO Board meeting.

These events aim to strengthen PAFO's organizational and strategic capacity, while promoting collaboration and exchange of best practices among its members.











### FO4 - AFRICA EVALUATION WORKSHOP



It was in Kigali, Rwanda, the headquarters of PAFO, that IFAD chose to hold the Evaluation Workshop of the Support Program for Farmers' Organizations in Africa (FO4-Africa). The three-day event brought together experts, facilitators and key stakeholders in the implementation of FO4 to assess the performance and sustainability of farmers' organizations (FOs) under the program. Participants had the opportunity to look back at successes and challenges, and to reflect on future opportunities: the post-FO4 era. Discussions focused on the concrete results of the Africa Program and led to the formulation of strategic recommendations to guide future initiatives. Through interactive sessions and fruitful exchanges, participants shared their experiences and visions for the future.

### **PARTICIPATORY APPROACH**





The workshop began with parallel working groups focusing on different critical aspects. One group assessed the delivery of economic services by farmer organizations (FOs) along priority value chains.

Their assessment highlighted both strengths and areas for improvement, with the aim of increasing economic benefits to members. Another group focused on the business environment, assessing FOs' efforts in policy dialogue and their influence on governance. Discussions centered on how FOs can engage more effectively in policy advocacy to create a favourable business environment. In addition, a working group analyzed the institutional development initiatives of FOs and tracked their progress. The aim was to identify successful strategies and areas for further development to strengthen institutional capacity.

### FIELD VISIT - INGABO FARMERS SYNDICATE



The IFAD team made a visit to the West of Kigali, in the Muhanga district, to meet with the INGABO FARMERS SYNDICATE, member of EAFF, East Africa, RFO member of PAFO. The IFAD representatives and advisors were able to learn about INGABO's activities in the cassava value chain through cooperatives and rural credit. The delegation also met directly with the local producer organizations involved in implementing the programme, encouraging a participatory approach to evaluation, suggestions and proposals for the future. The IFAD team studied the impact of FO4ACP in the field, closely evaluating the economic services provided, the integration of the value chain approach and the strengthening of institutional capacities.



The meeting of the Steering Committee meeting of the Farmers' Organizations at the Forefront of Research and Innovation in Agroecology for Sustainable Food Systems (FORI) program was chaired by PAFO CEO on behalf of the President. During the meeting, the European Commission and the Organization of African, Caribbean and Pacific States (OACPS) expressed satisfaction with the results achieved after two years of implementation. 








### **DERPIN PROJECT MEETING**










### ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP
